

What is the 30% energy tax credit?

Do the Math...

The federal government has created the Energy Tax Credit in order to benefit those who purchase and install specific types of energy efficient product in their homes. The credit applies to purchases and improvements made between January 1, 2009 and December 31, 2010 and may be as high as \$1500.

In order to qualify for this credit, storm doors, in combination with the exterior door over which it is installed, must:

- a) have a U factor and Solar Heat Gain Coefficient of 0.30 or below; and
- b) Meet the prescriptive criteria for such component established by the Dept of Energy IECC regulations.

What is a tax "credit"?

Unlike a deduction, which reduces that amount of taxable income, a tax credit directly reduces the tax itself. A tax credit can amount to considerable savings on your tax return.

How do you claim a tax credit?

For tax filing purposes, simply save your receipts when you purchase a qualifying item. Refer to your tax advisor for the appropriate form. For your records, print the manufacturer's certification statement from www.larsondoors.com.
